Overnight road closures in April 2024 – A12 Margaretting Bypass

We're continuing our work to rebuild the A12 Margaretting Bypass between junctions 13 (Ingatestone) and 15 (Three Mile Hill), including removing and replacing the current concrete road surface. Once complete, this will improve safety, create a smoother quieter journey, and extend the life of the road for 40 to 50 years.

Southbound overnight closures

We'll need to book a number of overnight closures on the southbound carriageway on the following evenings, so we can safely undertake landscaping and seeding within the verge.

Date of road closure	Closure
From 8pm to 5am each evening from Monday 22 to Friday 26 April	Southbound full closure junctions 16 (Galleywood) to 13 (Ingatestone)

The overnight carriageway closures are needed so that we can complete our work safely when traffic numbers are at their lowest.

A fully signed diversion route will be in place during these closures - please see the 'diversion information' section below for more details.

Please note that all closures are subject to change at short notice due to unforeseen circumstances or poor weather conditions. We encourage drivers to plan ahead and allow extra time when travelling. Please check our project webpage for the latest information before you begin your journey.

Diversion information

During these road closures, southbound traffic will be diverted southbound at junction 17, along the A130, before travelling west along the A127, ahead of re-joining the A12 (Gallows Corner). Please find a map showing the diversion, at the end of this eBulletin.
